EDITING, FROM THE "BIG PICTURE" TO THE PERSNICKITY

Facilitator: Allyson Foster

"Have you considered hiring an editor?" Few questions induce grimaces, eye rolls, and even feelings of existential dread in novice writers quite like it. And those reactions are valid! It can be intimidating to turn your manuscript over to a stranger for feedback and corrections. You may worry that an editor will impose themselves on your story to such an extent that it no longer feels like yours; that their comments will be hypercritical and undermine your confidence; or that they'll nitpick your grammar into oblivion without regard to context or intention.

But the truth is, a skilled fiction editor is your ally, not your adversary. Even the most experienced writers have blind spots when it comes to their own writing. An editor will bring a fresh perspective to your book, and their constructive feedback will help you craft a story on the page that is as vivid and compelling as the one in your imagination. Moreover, as a stand-in for prospective readers, an editor will run interference on those irksome infelicities, points of confusion, and momentum killers that diminish a reader's enjoyment and your book's saleability.

This session will demystify the different types and stages of editing, from the "big picture" to the persnickety. We'll discuss how to identify your editing needs, choose the right editor for your project, and make the most of your editing budget.

ALLYSON FOSTER has been a professional editor for over ten years. An inveterate word nerd, she finds joy in pretty much any editing project, be it copy editing a manual on how to prepare the perfect soufflé or doing a developmental edit of a book on 1990s one-hit wonders. But her first editing love and specialization is working with indie fiction authors who have been bitten by the writing bug and are in the early stretches of their storytelling journeys.

Prior to picking up her editing pencil, she worked in book publishing and lurked around the halls of academe teaching undergraduate English literature and composition courses.

JOANNA VANDER VLUGT is an author and illustrator. As a teenager, she drew charcoal portraits and wrote mysteries. Now, she uses Copic markers to illustrate motorcycles and scooters. Under the pseudonym J.C. Szasz, Joanna's short mysteries *Egyptian Queen*, and *The Parrot and Wild Mushroom Stuffing* were both published in Crime Writers of Canada mystery anthologies. Her essay, *No Beatles Reunion* was published in the *Dropped Threads 3: Beyond the Small Circle* anthology.

The Unravelling, her debut novel, and Dealer's Child were Canadian Book Club Awards finalists. Joanna draws upon her 13 years' experience working in the prosecutor's office and 10 years working in the Office of the Police Complaint Commissioner for inspiration for her novels. Joanna is the VP of Memberships for the Sinc-CW. Joanna has just released her novel, Spy Girls, the third in her Jade & Sage series. She's the Vice Chair and the BC/Yukon Rep of the Crime Writers of Canada and is a member of Sisters in Crime - Canada West, the Federation of of BC Writers, and the Royal City Literary Arts Society.
